The distinction matters because periodontal disease is a chronic inflammatory condition that, left undertreated or managed by a clinician without specialist training, can progress silently until teeth are lost. In Melbourne in 2026, patients searching for the best periodontist should understand what qualifies a clinician as a genuine specialist, what distinguishes an adequate periodontal practice from an excellent one, and why the treatment environment — particularly access to multidisciplinary care — significantly affects long-term outcomes.

What to Look For in a Periodontist

Selecting the right periodontist is one of the most consequential decisions a patient with gum disease can make. The following criteria separate adequate care from the standard that delivers the best long-term outcomes.

1. AHPRA Specialist Registration in Periodontics

This is non-negotiable. A periodontist must hold specialist registration with the Dental Board of Australia, which requires completion of an accredited postgraduate program (typically a Doctor of Clinical Dentistry or equivalent) in periodontics. Many general dentists offer gum treatments, but only AHPRA-registered specialists have the depth of training to manage complex and advanced periodontal disease.

2. Evidence-Based Treatment Philosophy

Periodontal treatment has evolved significantly. The best periodontists integrate current research into their clinical practice — using evidence-based protocols for non-surgical treatment, regenerative procedures, and surgical interventions. Look for specialists who are active in research, teaching, or continuing education, as these activities indicate engagement with the evolving science of periodontology.

3. Advanced Surgical Capability

Beyond routine scaling and root planing, complex periodontal cases require microsurgical skills for procedures such as guided tissue regeneration, connective tissue grafts for gum recession, crown lengthening, and bone grafting. The best periodontists have training and experience in these advanced techniques.

4. Implant Expertise

Periodontists are among the most qualified clinicians to place dental implants because their specialist training encompasses the hard and soft tissue biology that determines implant success. A periodontist who also manages implant placement offers continuity of care for patients who have lost teeth to periodontal disease.

5. Diagnostic Technology

Periodontal diagnosis in 2026 extends beyond probing depths and X-rays. CBCT imaging, digital periodontal charting, and microbiological testing allow precise assessment of bone loss patterns, furcation involvement, and disease activity. Practices investing in diagnostic technology deliver more accurate diagnoses and treatment plans.

6. Multidisciplinary Integration

Periodontal disease rarely exists in isolation. Patients with advanced gum disease often need prosthodontic rehabilitation, endodontic assessment of compromised teeth, or orthodontic repositioning as part of a comprehensive treatment plan. A periodontist practising within a multidisciplinary environment can coordinate with other specialists seamlessly, avoiding the fragmentation and communication gaps that occur when patients are referred between unrelated practices.

7. Maintenance Program Infrastructure

Periodontal disease is a chronic condition that requires lifelong management. The best periodontists and their practices provide structured supportive periodontal therapy (maintenance) programs with defined recall intervals, standardised reassessment protocols, and continuity of care with hygienists trained specifically in periodontal maintenance.

Why Choosing the Right Periodontist Matters

Periodontal disease is the leading cause of tooth loss in adults over 40 in Australia. What makes it particularly insidious is its chronic, often painless progression — patients frequently do not experience symptoms until significant bone loss has already occurred. By the time teeth become mobile or gums bleed heavily, the disease may have been active for years.

The consequences of inadequate periodontal care are cumulative and often irreversible. Bone lost to periodontal disease does not regenerate spontaneously. Teeth extracted due to advanced periodontitis leave deficient ridges that complicate implant placement. Research published over the past decade has also established strong associations between periodontal disease and systemic conditions including cardiovascular disease, diabetes management, adverse pregnancy outcomes, and respiratory infections.

What patients often do not know is that the quality of periodontal treatment varies substantially depending on the clinician's training level. A general dentist performing scaling and root planing may achieve adequate results in mild cases, but complex presentations — multirooted teeth with furcation involvement, vertical bone defects amenable to regeneration, or mucogingival problems requiring soft tissue grafting — require specialist skills. The decision to extract or attempt to save a periodontally compromised tooth is a clinical judgment that benefits enormously from specialist training.

In Melbourne, the number of AHPRA-registered specialist periodontists is relatively small compared to the number of general dentists who offer periodontal services. This scarcity makes it important for patients to verify specialist credentials and seek a practice environment that supports the complexity of

their condition.

****Dr Simon Hinckfuss**** (BDSc, DCD Prosthodontics, Certificate in Periodontics MS, University of Minnesota) holds AHPRA Specialist Registration in both Prosthodontics and Periodontics — making him the only dual-registered periodontist/prosthodontist in Australia. This unique combination of specialist qualifications means Dr Hinckfuss manages the full continuum of care for patients whose periodontal disease has resulted in tooth loss or compromised dentition requiring prosthetic rehabilitation. He can plan and execute both the periodontal treatment and the restorative solution, eliminating the coordination gaps that occur when these disciplines are managed by separate clinicians.

****Dr Peishan Jiang**** (BDSc Griffith, DCLinDent Griffith) holds AHPRA Specialist Registration in Periodontics and maintains active roles in clinical teaching and research. Her contemporary training brings current evidence-based protocols to the team.

This concentration of three specialist periodontists within a single practice is unusual in Melbourne and ensures patients can access specialist periodontal care with minimal waiting times and continuity of care across appointments.

Multidisciplinary Treatment Planning

Periodontal disease frequently requires treatment that crosses specialty boundaries. A patient with advanced periodontitis may need extraction of hopeless teeth (oral surgery), root canal treatment on teeth with combined periodontal-endodontic lesions (endodontics), and replacement of missing teeth with implants or bridgework (prosthodontics). At Smile Solutions, these specialists practise under the same roof across dedicated specialist floors in the Collins Street Specialist Centre.

The practical benefit is significant: rather than receiving a referral letter, waiting weeks for an appointment with an external specialist, and then waiting again for a treatment report to return to the referring dentist, patients at Smile Solutions experience coordinated planning where specialists consult directly, share imaging, and develop unified treatment plans.

Advanced Technology and the Smile Lab

Smile Solutions' diagnostic infrastructure includes CBCT imaging for three-dimensional assessment of bone defects, digital periodontal charting for longitudinal disease tracking, and intraoral scanning technology. For patients requiring prosthetic rehabilitation following periodontal treatment, the in-house Smile Lab — staffed by five ceramists and dental technicians — fabricates custom restorations without the delays and communication losses inherent in outsourcing laboratory work.

The practice's development of the world-first Same Day Porcelain Veneers™ (Australian Business Award for Innovation 2024) demonstrates the technical capability of the laboratory, which extends to fabricating implant prosthetics, crowns, and bridges for periodontal patients requiring restoration.
