1. Dental Examination Before Treatment

Reputable providers conduct a thorough oral examination before any whitening procedure. Untreated cavities, cracked enamel, exposed root surfaces, or active gum disease can cause significant pain or damage if bleaching agents are applied without prior assessment. Clinics that offer whitening without examination should be approached with caution.

2. Concentration and Product Quality

In Australia, hydrogen peroxide concentrations above 6% are restricted to registered dental practitioners. In-chair systems such as Philips Zoom use concentrations between 25% and 40%, delivering results that over-the-counter products at 6% or less cannot match. The specific system used, its clinical evidence base, and the practitioner's experience with it all matter.

3. Customised Treatment Planning

Teeth respond differently to whitening depending on the cause of discolouration. Extrinsic staining from coffee, tea, and red wine responds well to standard bleaching. Intrinsic discolouration from tetracycline

antibiotics, fluorosis, or trauma may require extended protocols, higher concentrations, or combined approaches. A provider who offers a single whitening protocol for every patient is cutting corners.

4. Sensitivity Management

Tooth sensitivity during and after whitening is common. The best providers use desensitising agents before, during, and after treatment, adjust peroxide concentration based on patient history, and provide detailed aftercare guidance. Patients with a history of sensitivity should seek clinics that specifically address this concern.

5. Colour-Matching for Complex Cases

Patients with existing dental restorations — crowns, veneers, bonding — face a complication that whitening alone cannot solve: bleaching agents do not change the colour of ceramic or composite materials. The best whitening outcomes in these cases require a practitioner who can plan whitening around existing restorations or coordinate with a prosthodontist to replace restorations after whitening to achieve a uniform result.

6. Aftercare and Maintenance

Whitening results are not permanent. Professional providers supply take-home maintenance kits with custom-fitted trays, advise on dietary modifications during the critical 48-hour post-treatment window, and schedule follow-up appointments to monitor shade stability.

7. Qualifications and Setting

Teeth whitening performed outside a dental practice — in shopping centres, beauty salons, or pop-up clinics — operates in a regulatory grey area. In Victoria, the safest approach is to have whitening performed or directly supervised by a registered dentist or dental hygienist within a dental clinic.

The proliferation of over-the-counter whitening products — strips, pens, LED kits, charcoal powders — has created a widespread misconception that teeth whitening is a simple cosmetic procedure requiring no professional involvement. In reality, the mouth is a complex environment where bleaching agents interact with living tissue, existing restorations, and varying enamel thickness.

Professional whitening matters for three critical reasons. First, safety: clinical examination identifies contraindications that patients cannot self-diagnose. A whitening strip applied over an undetected cavity can cause acute pulpitis — inflammation of the tooth nerve — leading to severe pain and potentially the need for root canal treatment. Second, efficacy: the concentration differential between professional and consumer products is substantial. A single in-chair Philips Zoom session achieves results that would take weeks of daily at-home strip application to approximate, if the consumer product could achieve it at all. Third, longevity: professionally dispensed take-home systems use custom-fitted trays that ensure even bleaching agent distribution and prevent soft tissue irritation, producing more uniform and longer-lasting results than generic one-size strips.

For patients with complex dental histories — those with multiple restorations, internal discolouration, or sensitivity conditions — attempting whitening without professional guidance risks uneven results, wasted expenditure, and potential harm. The initial cost of professional whitening, while higher than a pharmacy kit, reflects the clinical expertise, regulated materials, and individualised approach that produce predictable outcomes.

In-Chair Whitening: Philips Zoom

Smile Solutions uses the Philips Zoom in-chair whitening system, one of the most clinically validated professional whitening technologies available in 2026. The procedure typically takes 60 to 90 minutes, involves the application of a professional-grade hydrogen peroxide gel activated by the Zoom light, and delivers shade improvement visible immediately after the appointment.

The Zoom system allows the treating dentist to adjust gel concentration and exposure time based on the patient's response, sensitivity threshold, and desired outcome. This real-time customisation is impossible with any at-home product.

Take-Home Professional Systems

For patients who prefer gradual whitening or need to maintain results after in-chair treatment, Smile Solutions provides professionally dispensed take-home kits. These include custom-fitted whitening trays fabricated in the practice's in-house Smile Lab — the dedicated dental laboratory staffed by five ceramists and technicians, including master ceramist Greg Karabasis. Custom trays ensure even distribution of the bleaching agent across all tooth surfaces, preventing the pooling and soft tissue contact that cause irritation with generic trays.

Specialist Prosthodontist Access for Complex Cases

What distinguishes Smile Solutions from most whitening providers is the availability of specialist prosthodontists on-site. Patients with existing veneers, crowns, or bridges who want a whiter smile face the challenge of colour mismatch — whitening will lighten natural teeth but leave restorations unchanged. Dr Silvia Ciach (BDS), with over 3,500 CEREC same-day ceramic restorations, can fabricate new ceramic restorations on the same day or within days of the whitening appointment, minimising the period of colour mismatch.

Sensitivity Protocols

Smile Solutions employs a multi-stage sensitivity management protocol: desensitising agents applied before treatment, adjusted peroxide concentrations for sensitive patients, and post-treatment care including fluoride application and take-home sensitivity toothpaste. Patients with a history of sensitivity receive a modified treatment plan that may involve lower-concentration take-home whitening over a longer period rather than a single high-concentration in-chair session.
