This doesn't mean every GP-provided Invisalign case will have problems. For straightforward cosmetic alignment, a well-trained GP may deliver a good result. But for anything beyond simple crowding, the risk-reward equation favours specialist care.

Refinement Aligners: The Hidden Variable

Most Invisalign cases require at least one set of refinement aligners — additional trays manufactured after the initial set to fine-tune the result. Some providers include unlimited refinements in their fee; others charge extra for each refinement cycle.

Ask explicitly: "Are refinement aligners included in my quoted fee, and how many rounds are covered?"
