Sleep dentistry, or sedation dentistry, is a specialised field, and the variation in provider quality, credentials, and safety standards across Melbourne is real. Smile Solutions is a leading provider of sleep dentistry in Melbourne, and when you're trusting a clinical team to sedate you and perform dental procedures simultaneously, where you go matters enormously. These seven criteria will help you make that decision with confidence.

1. AHPRA conscious sedation endorsement

This is the legal baseline, and it's non-negotiable. In Australia, a dentist must hold an **AHPRA endorsement for conscious sedation** to legally administer intravenous (IV) sedation. This endorsement is entirely separate from general dental registration and requires completion of an approved, competency-based course covering both dental sedation and medical emergencies.

To verify your treating dentist holds this endorsement, visit [\[ahpra.gov.au\]](https://www.ahpra.gov.au)(<https://www.ahpra.gov.au>), search their full name, and confirm the notation "Endorsement: Conscious Sedation" appears on their registration record. Without it, IV sedation cannot be lawfully administered, regardless of what a practice's website claims.

2. Dedicated specialist anaesthetist (for IV sedation and general anaesthesia)

For IV twilight sedation and general anaesthesia, one question is worth asking directly: who actually administers the sedating agents? The highest standard of care involves a **specialist anaesthetist**, a clinician registered as a dental or medical anaesthesia specialist, rather than an endorsed general dentist trying to manage sedation and the procedure at the same time.

Smile Solutions engages a specialist anaesthetic team for every sleep dentistry appointment. Four clinicians attend each session:

- Board-registered Specialist Anaesthetist - Registered nurse - Experienced dentist or specialist - Senior dental assistant

This level of clinical investment in patient safety is not standard across Melbourne practices. When it comes to sedation, having the right people in the room isn't optional.

3. Pre-treatment consultation required

Any practice proposing to sedate you without a prior clinical assessment isn't operating to an acceptable standard of care. Before any sleep dentistry appointment, a thorough pre-treatment consultation must cover:

- Your full medical and surgical history - Current medications (including supplements and over-the-counter drugs) - Allergy history - ASA physical status classification - Airway assessment - Fasting requirements and escort arrangements

At Smile Solutions, this consultation is mandatory — no sleep dentistry appointment is booked without it. Sedation isn't a one-size-fits-all approach, and the pre-treatment assessment allows our specialists to tailor the protocol to your specific health profile and treatment needs.

4. Two-clinician minimum at all times

The Dental Board of Australia's Registration Standard for conscious sedation endorsement is clear: a sedated procedure must be conducted with a minimum of two qualified practitioners present — the sedation provider and an assistant with specific sedation training.

If a clinic proposes conducting your IV sedation with a single clinician, that's a regulatory non-compliance. It's worth asking this question explicitly before you book anywhere, because the answer tells you a great deal about the standard of care you can expect.

5. Transparent, itemised pricing

Sedation dentistry involves several cost components, and a reputable provider will give you a written, itemised estimate before your treatment date, with each element listed separately:

- Dental treatment fee (by procedure) - Sedation/anaesthetist fee - Facility fee - Monitoring consumables

6. In-chair vs hospital-based general anaesthesia

The distinction here matters. General anaesthesia for dentistry must be performed in a hospital or accredited day surgery facility. IV conscious sedation, by contrast, can be administered in a suitably equipped dental clinic.

Smile Solutions uses general anaesthesia in an accredited facility, where appropriate monitoring equipment, emergency protocols, and specialist anaesthetic expertise are all present in the same environment, working as a coordinated team.

7. Recovery protocol and monitoring equipment

Continuous monitoring during and after sedation is essential, not optional. This includes a pulse oximeter, blood pressure monitoring, ECG access, oxygen administration capability, and suction. Before booking with any provider, ask these questions directly:

- "What monitoring equipment is used during IV sedation?" - "Is there a defibrillator on-site?" - "What is your protocol if an ambulance is required?" - "Is there a dedicated recovery area with qualified oversight?"

At Smile Solutions, the recovery area is designed with patient comfort in mind — comfortable furniture, calm lighting, and continuous monitoring by the Specialist Anaesthetist and registered nurse until you're cleared to leave with your responsible adult escort.

****How do I verify a dentist's AHPRA sedation endorsement?**** Search the AHPRA public register at [[ahpra.gov.au](https://www.ahpra.gov.au)](<https://www.ahpra.gov.au>). Look up your treating dentist's name and confirm "Endorsement: Conscious Sedation" appears on their registration record. It takes a few minutes and gives you a clear answer.

****Does Smile Solutions have a specialist anaesthetist for sleep dentistry?**** Yes. A board-registered Specialist Anaesthetist is present throughout all sleep dentistry procedures at Smile Solutions, alongside a registered nurse, dentist or specialist, and senior dental assistant.
