What is a dental specialist?

In Australia, a dental specialist is a dentist who has completed at least three additional years of full-time postgraduate university training in a recognised specialty, then gained registration with AHPRA (the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency) as a specialist. This isn't a dentist with a particular interest in one area, or someone who has attended a series of weekend courses. Specialist registration is a protected title under Australian law — only those who have met the full educational and clinical requirements can call themselves a specialist. It's worth understanding that distinction before committing to any complex treatment.

The seven recognised dental specialties in Australia

****Orthodontics**** focuses on the alignment of teeth and jaws, helping patients achieve a functional bite and a confident smile.

****Periodontics**** deals with the health of the gums and the supporting structures of the teeth — the foundations that hold everything else in place.

****Endodontics**** covers root canal treatment and diseases of the dental pulp, often working to save teeth that might otherwise be lost.

****Prosthodontics**** addresses the restoration and replacement of teeth with crowns, bridges, dentures and implants, restoring both function and appearance.

****Oral and maxillofacial surgery**** covers surgical procedures of the mouth, jaw and face, including complex extractions and corrective procedures.

****Paediatric dentistry**** provides dental care for children and adolescents, tailored to their developmental needs.

****Special needs dentistry**** serves patients with physical, intellectual, medical or psychiatric conditions that require a personalised approach and a higher level of clinical consideration.

Why does it matter for you?

A general dentist is well equipped for routine care — examinations, fillings, simple extractions and preventive treatments. But when a case becomes more complex, the depth of training a specialist brings can be the difference between a good result and a genuinely excellent one.

Orthodontic treatment is a useful example. Many general dentists offer clear aligner therapy, but a registered orthodontist has spent years studying the biomechanics of tooth movement, growth and development patterns, and the management of complex malocclusions. They can anticipate complications before they arise and adjust treatment with a level of clinical precision that comes from years of focused postgraduate study.

The same logic applies across every specialty. An endodontist treating a complex molar with curved or calcified canals brings expertise that meaningfully improves the chance of saving the tooth. A periodontist managing advanced gum disease can offer surgical and regenerative techniques well beyond the scope of general practice. When you're dealing with a complex dental situation, access to a registered specialist — rather than a dentist with an interest in that area — provides a level of clinical assurance that's hard to replicate.
